WAGES COUNCILS ACT, 1959

Notice of Intention to make an Order varying the field of Operation of the Road Haulage Wages Council

Whereas the field of operation of the Road Haulage Wages Council applies to road haulage workers employed in connection with vehicles specified in an "A" or "B" licence granted under the Road Traffic Act, 1960;

And whereas Part V of the Transport Act, 1968, provides for the introduction of a new system of road haulage licensing and the abolition of "A", "B" and "C" licences granted under the said Act of 1960.

Now therefore the Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity hereby gives notice that she intends, in exercise of her powers under section 4 of the Wages Councils Act, 1959, to make an Order varying the field of operation of the Road Haulage Wages Council so that the said Council shall operate in relation to road haulage workers employed in an undertaking or a branch or department of an undertaking engaged in the carriage of goods by road wholly or mainly for hire or reward, and their employers.

OFFICES, SHOPS AND RAILWAY PREMISES ACT 1963

The Secretary of State hereby gives notice that on 6th December 1968 she made the Offices, Shops and Railway Premises Act 1963 (Exemption No. 7) Order 1968. The Order continues indefinitely the exemption granted by the Offices, Shops and Railway Premises Act 1963 (Exemption No. 3) Order 1965. The Order exempts, subject to conditions certain kiosks used for retail sales and situated in certain public open spaces or on or near beaches from the public open spaces or on or near beaches from the requirements relating to sanitary conveniences of
