COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1968

*Extinguishment of Public Right of Way over Land at Stanton-on-the-Wolds in the county of Nottingham.*

Notice is hereby given that the Nottinghamshire County Council in pursuance of their powers under section 3 of the Acquisition of Land (Authorisation Procedure) Act 1946 and section 31 and Schedule 3 of the Countryside Act 1968 have made an Order extinguishing as from the 19th day of December 1968, the public right of way over land between Willow Brook Road and Stanton Lane at Stanton-on-the-Wolds in the county of Nottingham between the point on the footpath 280 feet to the east of Willow Brook Road and Willow Brook being the footpath shown by a red line by way of identification only on the map hereinafter referred to.

*Highways Act 1959, Section 108*

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of the Administrative County of Nottingham under and by virtue of section 108 of the Highways Act 1959 intend on the 19th day of February 1969, at 10 a.m., to apply to the Magistrates' Court sitting at the Court House, Potter Street, Worksop, in the county of Nottingham, for an Order authorising the stopping-up for the purposes of vehicular traffic of an unclassified highway known as Little Lane at a point approximately 135 feet to the north of High Street and approximately 200 feet to the south of Retford Road in the Parish of Blyth in the county of Nottingham on the ground that such highway is unnecessary.

The point at which the highway is to be stopped up is shown by a black line on a plan deposited at County Hall, West Bridgford, Nottingham, and at the office of the Worksop Rural District Council, Highfield House, 222 Carlton Road, Worksop, Notts, where it is open for public inspection free of charge during normal office hours.

Any person who is interested in land adjoining the highway or who uses the highway or any other person who would be aggrieved by the making of the said Order has a right to be heard before the Court.

CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

HIGHWAYS ACT, 1959

*(Yarnfield No. 1) Public Path Diversion Order, 1968*

Notice is hereby given that on the 18th December 1968, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed with modifications the above Order.

Its effect will be to extinguish the public right of way being a 'footpath' of a width of 4 ft. 6 in. or thereabouts which commences from Point A on the

south side of the Stone to Yarnfield Road and running south south-west to Point B for a distance of 193 yards, as shown coloured brown on the map contained in the Order, and to substitute therefore a new footpath (shown coloured green on the map contained in the said Order) starting from Point C running in a westerly direction thence southerly utilising the footpaths proposed for the new housing development to Point D on the boundary fence, thence westerly to Point B for a total distance of 258 yards.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at Rural Council Offices, Stone, Staffs, between 10 a.m. and 12 noon and between 2 p.m. and 4 p.m. on week-days, excluding Saturdays.

The Order becomes operative as from 3rd January 1969 but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within 6 weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.

*Footpath Diversion, Winnall, Winchester*
