ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967

The Trunk Road (Wimborne Minster, Dorset) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order, 1969.

The Minister of Transport proposes to make an Order under sections 1 and 3 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 the effect of which will be:

- 1. To prohibit waiting:

 - (i) in any of the parts of road specified in Schedule 1 to this notice;
 (ii) between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. in any of the parts of road specified in Schedule 2 to this notice;
- 2. To restrict waiting between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. in any of the parts of road specified in Schedule 3 to this notice:
 - (ii) for a longer period than 30 minutes; or
 (ii) if a period of less than 30 minutes has
 elapsed since the termination during the said
 hours of waiting (if any) of the vehicle in those parts of road.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, or to enable the vehicle to be used in con-nection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the main-tenance of the road or the services therein or to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle.
