## HIGHWAYS ACT 1959—SECTION 108

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the County Borough of Wolverhampton the Highway Authority, intends to apply to the Magistrates' Court sitting at the Town Hall, Wolverhampton, on Thursday, 6th February 1969, at the hour of 10 in the forenoon for orders that the following highways or parts of highways be authorised to be stopped up on the grounds that they are unnecessary:

- (1) That part of the Highway known as North Street, Wednesfield, for a distance of 193 yards or thereabouts southwards from Graiseley Lane.
- (2) The highway known as Hickman Street, Wednesfield, together with that part of the highway known as Cross Street, Wednesfield, for a distance of 62 yards or thereabouts southwards from Hickman Street, and together with that part of the highway known as New Street, Wednesfield, for a distance of 47 yards or thereabouts northwards from the southernmost point of its junction with Hickman Street.

The effect of the said orders is shown in a plan which may be inspected free of charge at the offices of the Council at the Town Hall, Wolverhampton, between the hours of 8.45 a.m. and 4.45 p.m. Monday to Friday.

## SUBMISSION OF PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER

## HIGHWAYS ACT, 1959

*The City and County of Bristol (Brentry Hospital)  
Public Path Diversion Order, 1969*

Notice is hereby given that the above Order made on the 1st day of January 1969, is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Its effect will be to divert a section of the public right of way running from a point B. 337 yards west of a point 3 on the map situated on the north-west side of Charlton Road approximately 80 yards north-east of Elderberry Walk Brentry to Brentry Lane to proceed thence for approximately 23 yards in a north-westerly direction then skirting the southern boundary of field OS.615 for 203 yards and alongside the western boundary of field OS.615 for 257 yards to terminate at a point in Brentry Lane near the junction of that road with Knole Lane.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the office of the Acting Town Clerk, The Council House, College Green, Bristol 1, and may be inspected free of charge on Mondays and Tuesdays between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 5.15 p.m. and on Wednesday to Fridays between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 5 p.m.
