

SCHEDULE

That part of the London—Fishguard Trunk Road (A.48), at Langstone in the county of Monmouth, which extends from a point 1,398 feet north-east of the centre of Coldra Roundabout in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 400 feet, and which forms a cul-de-sac on the south-east side of that part of the said trunk road which constitutes a carriageway for through traffic.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The proposed Order will prohibit vehicles from proceeding in the cul-de-sac situated to the east of Langstone Cottages, Langstone, unless requiring access to premises on that road.

HIGHWAYS ACT, 1959

The East of Llansamlet—Llangyfelach Special Roads Scheme

The Secretary of State hereby gives notice that he has made a Scheme under section 11 of the above Act, authorising the Secretary of State to provide:

- (a) a special road as a Motorway from a point east of Llansamlet in the county borough of Swansea to a point at Llangyfelach in the county of Glamorgan; and
- (b) six special roads as connecting roads between the above-mentioned Motorway and the Swansea—Neath road (A.48) and the Mumbles—Sennybridge road (A.4067)

for the exclusive use of the traffic of Classes 1 and 11 set out in Schedule 4 to the said Act as amended by the Special Roads (Classes of Traffic) Order, 1961, and providing for the special roads to become trunk roads on the date when the Scheme comes into operation.

Copies of the Scheme, the title of which is "The East of Llansamlet—Llangyfelach Special Roads Scheme, 1969" (S.I. No. 71), can be purchased, price 6d., either through any bookseller, or direct from any branch of Her Majesty's Stationery Office.

Any person aggrieved by the Scheme and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act, 1959, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act, or of regulations made thereunder, has not been complied with in relation to the Scheme, may within six weeks from 14th February 1969, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Scheme or of any provision contained therein.

The London—Fishguard Trunk Road (Lonlas Diversion) Order, 1969

The Secretary of State hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under sections 7 and 44 of the above Act providing:

- That the roads which he proposes to construct at Lon-Las in the county borough of Swansea and at Llangyfelach in the county of Glamorgan shall become trunk roads as from the date when the Order comes into operation.

The Newport—Shrewsbury Trunk Road (East of Hall's Bridge, Llangua) Order, 1969

- (b) that the length of the Newport—Shrewsbury Trunk Road to be superseded shall cease to be a trunk road as from the 1st April next after the date on which notice is given by the Secretary of State to the County Council of Monmouth (who will become the highway authority responsible for that length) that the new trunk road is open to traffic.
