On 5th November 1968, a Whirlwind helicopter, flying over Malaysia, suffered engine failure. The pilot, and crew of two, crash-landed in dense primary jungle with trees over 100 ft. high. After the aircraft had plunged through the trees, the jungle canopy sprang back into position, making rescue operations very difficult, since the Search and Rescue Whirlwind winch cable is only 60 ft. long. Flight Sergeant Fitton, the winchman of the helicopter of No. 103 Squadron detailed to rescue the party, meticuously and succinctly briefed his crew and a medical officer on the requirements and sequences of a newly developed rescue system which can be used needcal officer on the requirements and sequences of a newly developed rescue system which can be used to recover survivors from a depth of 250 ft. This system is named "Multi-Tape-Lift" and the operating techniques are complex and prolonged. Great skill and nerve are required by the whole crew, but the major responsibility and its attendant hazards rest with the winchman. Flight Sergeant Fitton spent over an hour suspended 50 ft. below the aircraft, swinging among tree tons beneath the level of the swinging among tree tops beneath the level of the jungle canopy and 50 ft. or more above the ground;

one false move could have been fatal to all con-cerned. In all he completed the complicated rescue cerned. In all he completed the complicated rescue procedure five times; first lowering the medical officer to the ground, then lifting out the pilot and crew and finally the medical officer, transferring each of them from the tapes to the winch, in mid-air. It was the first time that such a rescue had been attempted in the Far East and, due to Flight Sergeant Fitton's skill, cool calculated courage and outstanding determination, the very difficult and hazardous operation was completely successful. By his prompt action, he was directly responsible for the quick recovery of the three crew members, one of whom was injured and unable to move. Flight Sergeant Fitton's calmness and authoritative manner inspired the remainder of the rescue party. His leadership and direction were exemplary, and his flawless performance was consistent with the highest traditions of the Royal Air Force.
