Melbourne Conservation Area

Notice is hereby given that the Derbyshire County Council have in exercise of their duty to determine what parts of their area of special architectural or historic interest the character or appearance of which it is desirable to preserve or enhance, have designated the Town Centre of Melbourne, comprising the area bounded by and including Melbourne Castle, Castle Mills, properties on the north side of Blackwell Lane to Blackwell Brook, Melbourne Hall Gardens, the footpath and woods adjoining the Pool, the east part of Parcel 380 on O.S. LVIII.6 Revision of 1937, the wooded east part of Parcel 377 measuring 2.842 acres on the same map, the footpath joining Penn Lane with High Street, properties fronting High Street, except the County School, properties west of the Market Place and Derby Road south of Dunnington Lane, two houses north of the Baptist Church on the east side of Derby Road, the Baptist Church, the south end of Chapel Street, properties on Potter

Street, and the west side of Castle Street up to and including properties north and west of the Fire Station; and including Church Street and the Church Close in the South-East Derbyshire Rural District in the County of Derby as a Conservation Area.

In exercise of powers under various legislation special attention is to be paid to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of Conservation Areas. Certain planning applications will be advertised and any representations made thereon will be taken into account.

A copy of the map defining the Conservation Area will be available for inspection at the Rural District Council Offices, St. Mary's Gate, Derby, and at the County Offices, Matlock, during normal office hours.
