BRADFORD CITY COUNCIL

HIGHWAYS ACT, 1959—SECTION 108

Proposed stopping-up of part of a footpath commencing on the north side of Woodhead Road at a point 38 yards east of the centre of Summerville Road and extending in a northerly direction for a distance of 84 yards or thereabouts terminating at the southern side of Turner Street.

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the City of Bradford, the Highway Authority, intends to apply to the Magistrates' Court sitting at the City Hall, Bradford, on the 12th March 1969, for an Order that the footpath commencing on the north side of Woodhead Road at a point 38 yards east of the centre of Summerville Road and extending in a northerly direction for a distance of 84 yards or thereabouts terminating at the southern side of Turner Street, be authorised to be stopped-up on the ground that it is unnecessary.

The effect of the said Order is shown on the plan which may be inspected free of charge at the Town Clerk's Office, City Hall, Bradford 1, at all reasonable hours.

At the hearing of the application, the owners and occupiers of all land adjoining the highway to be stopped-up, statutory undertakers, any person who uses the highway and any other person aggrieved, shall have the right to be heard.

Proposal to apply for an Order authorising the stopping up of a highway
