Detective Constable Bethwaite and a colleague were called to the Khandallah Domain following a report from the caretaker that a man, then unknown, had been annoying young girls who were at the swimming pool. Actually it transpired that this man, who was identified as Novak, had asked two young girls to accompany him into the nearby bush.

Novak became aware of the presence of the Police and fled along a track into the bush. He was pursued by Detective Constable Bethwaite but would not respond to a call to come out. Instead he ran away but was quickly overhauled by Bethwaite who grappled with him at the foot of a steep slope. Novak had an overnight bag in his possession and this contained an unsheathed knife which he swung wildly at the Detective Constable. During the struggle Novak was making incoherent noises and generally acting in a maniacal manner. The pair fell to the ground and Novak had the knife in the Detective Constable's chest and it was with great difficulty that he was prevented from inflicting a mortal wound. Bethwaite called for assistance and it was then that Brian Clark, who was nearby with some other young children, went to his aid. The young lad reached between the two men and actually grabbed the blade of the knife thus enabling it to be pushed away. Brian Clark received a cut to his hand necessitating fifteen stitches.

It is beyond doubt that but for this boy going to the assistance of the Detective Constable this member would have been murdered, because it was subsequently revealed that Novak was a mentally deranged and very dangerous person. Bethwaite states that he owes his life to the bravery of Brian Clark.

Our Will and Pleasure is that the provisions which are set out in the Schedule attached to this Our Warrant for the increase of such pensions shall have effect from 1st April 1969.

SCHEDULE

1. In this Warrant, unless the context otherwise requires:

- (a) "pension" means a pension of the classes described in paragraph 2 of this Schedule, payable in respect of service specified in paragraph 3 of this Schedule, not being a pension payable to a person resident in India, Pakistan, Burma or Aden;
- (b) "service pension" and "service element of pension" include Indian Element of pension.

2. The following are the classes of pension referred to in paragraph 1 of this Schedule:

- (1) Service pensions and the service portion of disability pensions under Indian or Burma Regulations or under the Third Schedule to the Warrant dated 21st May 1955, of
 - (a) European officers of the Armed Forces of the former British India who held Commissions in Our Land Forces and all officers of the Indian Medical Service;
 - (b) officers and warrant officers of the India Unattached List;
 - (c) European officers and warrant officers of the Royal Indian Navy or Royal Indian Naval Volunteer Reserve;
 - (d) European officers and warrant officers who formed part of the Armed Forces of Burma before 4th January 1948;
 - (e) members of the Queen Alexandra's Military Nursing Service for India;
 - (f) officers and warrant officers of the Indian Medical Department (British Cadre);
 - (g) Indian officers of the Armed Forces of the former British India and members of the Indian Military Nursing Service who were, on 1st April 1955, permanently resident in the United Kingdom.

(2) Service pensions payable under the authority of the Pensions (India, Pakistan and Burma) Act, 1955, to officers of the Royal Engineers, the Royal Artillery, the Royal Corps of Signals, the Continuous Indian Service Cadre of the Royal Army Veterinary Corps and the Army Educational Corps.

(3) Service family pensions at ordinary rates, in respect of officers and warrant officers within any description in paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d) or (f) of sub-paragraph (1) of this paragraph.

(4) Pensions in respect of distinguished or meritorious service.

3. The service referred to in paragraph 1 of this Schedule is service, whether by the recipient of the pension or by some other person:

- (a) which, except in the case of service in the Armed Forces of Burma, ended before 15th August 1947, or the termination of which was attributable to the passing of the Indian Independence Act, 1947, or
- (b) which, in the case of service in the Armed Forces of Burma, ended before 4th January 1948, or the termination of which was attributable to the passing of the Burma Independence Act, 1947, or
- (c) which was rendered by a person who in the opinion of our Minister for the time being responsible for the administration of the classes of pension referred to in paragraph 1 of this Schedule was domiciled outside Asia at the date when the service began, such date being, except in the case of service in the Armed Forces of Burma, a date before 15th August 1947 and, in the case of service in the Armed Forces of Burma, a date before 4th January 1948.

4. A pension may be increased provided either:

- (a) the pensioner has attained the age of sixty years, or where the pension is a widow's pension, forty years, or
- (b) the pensioner, if receiving a pension as the child of a deceased officer or warrant officer has not attained the age of sixteen years, or having attained that age, is receiving full time instruction in an educational establishment, or is undergoing training for a trade, profession or vocation in such circumstances that he is required to devote the whole of his time to that training for a period of not less than two years or

(c) the pensioner on being invalided from the service was awarded a service pension for the first, or only time, or

(d) the pensioner is a woman with at least one dependant (as defined in paragraph 7 below), or

(e) the pensioner is permanently incapacitated by physical or mental infirmity from engaging in any regular full-time employment.

5. The amount of the increase shall be eighteen per cent of the pension payable to the pensioner at the time when the increase becomes payable, including any pension increase awarded or admissible under the Warrants of 4th August 1956, 14th September 1959, 25th February 1963, and 6th May 1966 and also including any part of the pension which has been commuted after 31st March 1969. For the purpose of the calculation, any fraction of a pound of the annual pension shall be treated as a whole pound.

6. Any general condition attaching to the grant or continuance of a pension shall also apply to the grant or continuance of any increase to that pension.

7. The expression "dependant" for the purpose of paragraph 4 shall mean a person wholly or mainly supported by the pensioner who either:

(a) has not attained the age of sixteen years, or who is in receipt of full time instruction at an educational establishment, or undergoing training for any trade, profession or vocation in such circumstances that he is required to devote the whole of his time to that training for a period of not less than two years or

(b) immediately before the date of effect of this present Warrant, qualified the pensioner, under former Warrants, for an increase of pension which would otherwise have been inadmissible.

8. The grant of an increase of pension under this Warrant shall not affect entitlement to increases under the Warrants of the 4th August 1956, of 14th September 1959, of 25th February 1963, or of 6th May 1966 and any increase granted under this Warrant shall be disregarded in assessing the increase admissible under those Warrants.

GREATER LONDON COUNCIL (GENERAL POWERS) ACT 1967

North Lambeth—Proposed Controlled Parking Scheme

1. The Lambeth Borough Council is applying to the Greater London Council for Orders under Sections 6, 35, 36, 37, 38 and 40 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as extended by Section 26 of the Greater London Council (General Powers) Act 1967, to designate parking places (some controlled by meters and some for use by residents controlled by season tickets) and to introduce restrictions on waiting by vehicles on certain highways in the North Lambeth area of the London Borough of Lambeth.

2. The general effect of the proposed Orders would be to make into a controlled parking zone the area bounded generally by the River Thames, Parry Street, South Lambeth Road, Kennington Lane, Newington Butts and the common boundary between the Boroughs of Lambeth and Southwark, between Newington Butts and the River.

3. The proposed Parking Places Order would:

- (i) designate parking places in the highways named in the First Schedule hereto;
- (ii) specify the maximum number of parking bays (i.e. spaces on the carriageway where vehicles may be left) in each parking place; provide that the number of such parking bays up to the specified maximum, and the situation of the parking bays in each parking place, may be determined by the Borough Council; and provide that parts of certain parking places shall not be occupied by parking bays in order that space may be available for vehicles to load and unload;
- (iii) provide that the expression "permitted hours" shall mean, for the purposes of the Order, the period between 8.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive and the period between 8.30 a.m. and 1.30 p.m. on Saturdays, any such day not being Christmas Day, Good Friday or a Bank Holiday;
- (iv) provide that the parking bays in the parking places referred to in Part I of the First Schedule hereto may be used for the leaving during the permitted hours of such vehicles as are passenger vehicles, goods vehicles, motor cycles or invalid carriages, for a maximum initial period of two hours;
- (v) provide that the parking bays in the parking places referred to in Part II of the First Schedule hereto may be used for the leaving during the permitted hours of such vehicles as are passenger vehicles, goods vehicles, motor cycles or invalid carriages, for a maximum initial period of four hours;
- (vi) provide that the parking spaces in the parking places referred to in Part III of the First Schedule hereto may be used during the permitted hours only for the leaving of such vehicles as display in a specified manner a valid season ticket issued by the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth and are passenger vehicles, goods vehicles the overall height of which does not exceed seven feet six inches, motor cycles or invalid carriages;
- (vii) provide that the Council may issue a permit to any person whose usual place of abode is at premises the postal address of which is in any street or part of a street in that area of the London Borough of Lambeth referred to in the second paragraph of this notice and who is the owner of a vehicle of a class specified in sub-paragraph 3 (vi) above;
- (viii) provide that during the permitted hours the initial charge for a vehicle left in a parking place referred to in Part I of the First Schedule hereto shall be at the rate of one shilling for one hour (maximum initial period: two hours); for a vehicle left in a parking place referred to in Part II of the First Schedule hereto shall be at the rate of two shillings for two hours (maximum initial period: four hours); for a vehicle left in a parking place referred to in Part III of the First Schedule hereto the charge shall be one pound for one calendar month, or three pounds for three months; and for a coach left in a parking place referred to in Part IV of the First Schedule hereto the charge shall be two shillings for thirty minutes (maximum initial period: thirty minutes);
- (ix) provide that the initial charge shall be payable on the leaving of the vehicle in a parking place referred to in Part I or Part II or Part IV of the First Schedule hereto by the insertion of a coin or coins in the parking meter relating to the parking bay in which the vehicle is left;
- (x) provide that an excess charge of ten shillings shall be payable to the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth in respect of any vehicle left in a parking place referred to in Part I or Part IV of the First Schedule hereto for longer than the period for which payment was made by the initial charge;
- (xi) provide that an excess charge of one pound shall be payable to the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth in respect of any vehicle left in a parking place referred to in Part II of the First Schedule hereto for longer than the period for which payment was made by the initial charge;
- (xii) provide that the period for which a vehicle may be left in a parking place referred to in Part I of the First Schedule hereto after the excess charge has been incurred shall not exceed one hour;
- (xiii) provide that the period for which a vehicle may be left in a parking place referred to in Part II of the First Schedule hereto after the excess charge has been incurred shall not exceed two hours;
- (xiv) provide that the period for which a vehicle may be left in a parking place referred to in Part IV of the First Schedule hereto after the excess charge has been incurred shall not exceed fifteen minutes;
- (xv) provide that the charge in respect of a vehicle left in a parking place described in Part III of the First Schedule hereto shall be payable by the issue of a season ticket and by displaying in the manner prescribed in the Order that season ticket relating to that vehicle not later than on the leaving of the vehicle in such a parking place;
- (xvi) prescribe the manner in which vehicles shall stand in parking places;
- (xvii) empower the Council to install parking meters at parking places;
- (xviii) make other incidental provision.

4. The other Orders for which application is being made would:

- (i) maintain existing restrictions on waiting by vehicles (including restrictions on loading and unloading) in the proposed controlled parking zone;
- (ii) restrict waiting by vehicles between 8.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive and between 8.30 a.m. and 1.30 p.m. on Saturdays in all the public streets in the proposed controlled parking zone excluding those streets or parts of streets where other waiting restrictions already apply (see sub-paragraph 4(i) above) and those lengths of streets designated as parking places by the proposed Parking Places Orders (the restrictions would permit vehicles to wait for a limited period (a) to load and unload goods except as prohibited in accordance with sub-paragraph 4(i) above; (b) to pick up and set down passengers; and (c) for certain other specified purposes);
- (iii) designate Cycle Parking Areas in the streets specified in the Second Schedule hereto and provide that a bicycle propelled by mechanical power and not having a side-car attached thereto may wait in a prescribed manner in any Cycle Parking Area so designated;

(iv) institute one-way traffic working in the street specified in the first column of the Third Schedule hereto, in the direction specified in the second column of that Schedule;

(v) make other incidental provision.

5.
