

## STAFFORDSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

*Notice of application to stop-up part of a public highway known as Dark Lane, Whittington in the Rural District of Seisdon in the County of Stafford.*

Notice is hereby given that the Staffordshire County Council as Highway Authority intends to apply to the Magistrates Court sitting at Wombourne, on the 29th day of May 1969, at the hour of 10.30 a.m. in the forenoon for an Order that part of the highway known as Dark Lane, Whittington in the Rural District of Seisdon commencing at a point (point "A") situated near Anchor Inn and ending at a point (point "B") situated at the Whittington Horse Bridge some 227 yards or thereabouts to the east be authorised to be stopped up such application being made on the ground that the said highway is unnecessary.
