DERBY COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCIL

*The Derby Corporation (Victory Road) (Waiting Restrictions) Order 1969*

Notice is hereby given that the Derby County Borough Council have made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 the effect of which will be to prohibit the waiting of vehicles on weekdays between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. in Victory Road and Sinfin Lane (between the railway bridge and Thackeray Street).

Vehicles used in connection with funerals, building operations or demolition adjacent to these roads, the boarding or alighting of passengers and the loading or unloading of goods will not be affected by the Order.

The Order will come into operation on 26th May 1969.

A copy of the Order and of a map showing the roads to which it relates may be inspected at the Town Clerk's Office, the Council House, Derby, during normal office hours.

Any person desiring to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 or on the ground that any requirement of section 1 or sections 84A, 84B or 84C of that Act or of any regulation made under the said Section 84C has not been complied with may make application to the High Court for that purpose within six weeks from the 26th May 1969.
