TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE LONDON MINT

1. We, whose names are hereunder written, were sworn on the 27th day of February 1969 before the Queen's Remembrancer at Goldsmiths' Hall in the City of London to make assays and trials of Her Majesty's coins which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Royal Mint in London were coined in the said Mint from the 1st day of January 1968 to the 31st day of December 1968, both dates inclusive, in accordance with the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1946, or the Decimal Currency Act, 1967, and were set aside and placed in the pyx of the said Mint as prescribed by regulations made under the said Acts.

2. In this Verdict the expression "the Coinage Acts" means the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1946, the expression "the Decimal Currency Act" means the Decimal Currency Act, 1967, and the expressions "permitted variation from standard weight", "permitted variation from standard fineness", "permitted variation from standard diameter" means respectively the variation from the standard weight, the variation from the standard weight, the variation from the standard weight, the variation from the standard meeter" means from the standard composition and the variation from the standard diameter allowed under the coinage Acts, in respect of coins made in accordance with those Acts or under the Decimal Currency
