The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas the Minister of Housing and Local Government, after giving to the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the Parish of St. John the Baptist, Portland, in the County of Dorset, ten days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act 1853 as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to Her Majesty in Council that for the protection of the Public Health burials should be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the burial ground known as "The Strangers Cemetery", near Victoria Square,

Portland, in the said Parish, as shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 22nd day of August next.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the *London Gazette*, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 22nd day of August.
