Whereas the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity and the Board of Trade, in pursuance of their powers under section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, referred the above-mentioned question to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for examination and have published the text of the reference in the Gazette on 20th February 1969;

2. And whereas by section 5(3) of the Act, but subject to section 5(4), the Board are required to make their report so as to allow publication within three months of the said date;

3. And whereas, in pursuance of their powers under the said section 5(4), the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity and the Board of Trade, by a direction published in the Gazette on 16th May 1969, extended the said period of three months by one month;

4. Now, therefore, the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity and the Board of Trade, in pursuance of their powers under the said section 5(4), hereby direct that the said period of three months be further extended by three months.

DANGEROUS DRUGS ACT 1965

WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORITIES

Whereas David Brown, M.B., B.S., whose registered address is 1 Quay Haven, Swanwick Lane, Southampton, is, under Regulations 4 and 10 of the Dangerous Drugs (No. 2) Regulations 1964, authorised, by virtue of being a duly qualified medical practitioner, to possess and supply drugs and other substances to which the said Regulations respectively apply so far as may be necessary for the practice of severice of as may be necessary for the practice or exercise of his said profession:
