Notice of proposal to apply for an Order authorising the stopping up to all traffic of an un-made length of highway known as Brookside Lane, High Lane, subject to the reservation of a footpath over a section of that highway.

Notice is hereby given that the Urban District Council of Marple being the highway authority for the highway hereinafter mentioned intend to apply to the Magistrates' Court sitting at the County Magistrates' Court, Hall Street, Stockport, on Thursday the 24th day of July 1969, at the hour of 10 a.m. for an Order under section 108 of the Highways Act, 1959, authorising the whole length of the un-made highway known as Brookside Lane, High Lane, running between the entrance to the Woodside Tennis Club and the entrance to Brookside County Primary School at Ashbourne Drive for a distance of approximately 160 yards to be stopped up to all traffic on the grounds that it is unnecessary subject only to the reservation of a footpath along that section of the highway between the entrance to the Woodside Tennis Club and the north-western boundary fence of Brookside County Primary School for a distance of approximately 95 yards.

The effect of the proposed Order is shown on the plan deposited at the Clerk's Office, Council Offices, Marple, where it may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours.

Newbury Rural District (Brimpton No. 1) Diversion Order, 1969

Notice is hereby given that on the 19th day of June 1969, the Newbury Rural District Council confirmed the above Order.

Its effect is to divert as from the 11th day of July 1969 the public right of way running from a point on Public Footpath No. 6 in the Parish of Brimpton opposite the south-western entrance to Brimpton Church and running in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 205 feet to the same point on Public Footpath No. 6 in the parish of Brimpton, running in a southerly direction for a distance of 69 feet to meet the existing footpath.
