THE COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1968

*County of Wilts (Footpath 50 Calne) Diversion
Order, 1969*

Notice is hereby given that the Wilts County Council in pursuance of their powers under section 3 of The Acquisition of Land (Authorisation Procedure) Act 1946 as amended by section 31 of the Countryside Act 1968, have made an Order extinguishing as from 6th July 1969, a part of the public right of way known as Footpath 50 in the Borough of Calne, from a point approximately 80 yards north-east of its junction with Pippin Road leading north-east for a distance of approximately 90 yards only across a field now scheduled as a site for a Health Centre and marked number 96 on the Ordnance Survey Map. An alternative route will be provided from the operative date of the Order from a point approximately 80 yards north-east of the junction of Footpath 50, Calne with Pippin Road, leading east-north-east for a distance of approximately 80 yards then north-west for a distance of approximately 40 yards.

The right of way to be extinguished is shown coloured red and marked by the letters "A" and "C" on a map which may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours at the offices of the Town Clerk, Patford Street, Calne, or in Room 224 at the offices of the undersigned. The map referred to also shows coloured blue and marked by the letters "A", "B" and "C" the alternative right of way to be provided.

*The Borough of Ellesmere Port (Footpath No. 9, Great
Sutton) Public Path Diversion Order, 1969*

Notice is hereby given that on the 12th June 1969, the Ministry of Housing and Local Government confirmed without modifications the above-named Order. The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the public right of way running from a point opposite the junction of Glendyke Road

with Glencoe Road in a generally westerly direction for a distance of approximately 500 feet to a line running from a point opposite the junction of Glendyke Road with Glencoe Road along the footways on the southerly side of Glencoe Road and on the south-easterly side of Gerrard Avenue for a distance of approximately 595 feet in a generally north-westerly and then a generally south-westerly direction.

A copy of the Order as confirmed and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the offices of the undersigned between the hours of 8.45 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. Monday to Friday. The Order becomes operative as from Thursday, 3rd July 1969, but if a person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Acts, 1959, as amended or on the ground that any requirement of the Act as amended or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he may under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 7 to the Act within 6 weeks from 26th June 1969, make an application for the purpose to the High Court.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

HIGHWAYS ACT, 1959

*The County Borough of Preston (Ashton Marsh)
Public Path Extinguishment Order, 1969*

Notice is hereby given that the above-mentioned Order made on the 12th June 1969, is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by the Council of the County Borough of Preston.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to extinguish the public footpath of undefined width over part of Ashton Marsh in the Borough of Preston which commences on the southerly side of Riversway (A.583) at point "A" on the map contained in the said Order situate 855 feet or thereabouts east of the westerly boundary of the said Borough and runs thence generally south for 60 feet or thereabouts to point "B" on the said map then south-easterly for 410 feet or thereabouts through point "C" to point "D" on the said map then south-westerly for 1,000 feet or thereabouts to point "E" on the said map and then westerly for 1,230 feet or thereabouts terminating at the westerly boundary of the said Borough at point "F" on the said map.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Town Clerk's Office, Municipal Building, Preston, between 9 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. on weekdays and between 9 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Town Clerk, Municipal Building, Lancaster Road, Preston, before the 23rd July 1969, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made or if any so made are withdrawn the Council of the County Borough of Preston may, instead of submitting the Order to the Minister of Housing and Local Government, themselves confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Minister any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.
