WEST RIDING OF YORKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

CIVIC AMENITIES ACT 1967

Rotherham Rural District Conservation Area at Laughton-en-le-Morthen

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of the West Riding of Yorkshire as local planning authority after consultation with the Rotherham Rural District Council have designated the area referred to in the Schedule to this notice as a Conservation Area in accordance with section 1 of the Civic Amenities Act 1967. The area is one which the County Council consider to be an area of special architectural or historic interest the character or appearance of which should be preserved or enhanced, and will be the subject of stringent control of development. The County Council intend to take such action as may be available to them to secure the preservation of the character and the general improvement of the area.

The Conservation Area is defined on a plan which may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours at the office of the County Planning Officer, Raines House, Denby Dale Road, Wakefield, at the office of the Area Planning Officer, Station Road, Doncaster, or at the office of the Clerk to Rotherham Rural District Council, Council Offices, Moor-gate, Rotherham.

THE SCHEDULE

Rotherham Rural District, Laughton-en-le-Morthen

The conservation area is situated in the western part of the village approximately centred on All Saints Church. Starting about 30 feet east of Number 36 High Street, the boundary runs south following the rear boundaries of Numbers 2 to 18 Mellow Fields Road for a distance of about 340 feet. It then turns westwards along the southern boundary of the properties fronting on to High Street and Church Corner for a distance of about 730 feet. From here, it runs in a northerly direction along the western boundaries of Number 13 Church Corner, Castle Hill and the cemetery. It follows the northern boundary of Number 45 High Street and continues eastwards across High Street to the north-west corner of the curtilage of Number 60 High Street. It runs in an easterly direction along the boundary to the south of the footpath for a distance of about 625 feet.

It then runs in a southerly direction for a distance of about 440 feet to join High Street and includes Church Farm.
