When this Order comes into effect the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this notice will become subject to a speed limit of 30 m.p.h.

Intervening lengths of unclassified roads provided with a system of street lighting furnished by means of lamps placed not more than 200 yards apart will also be subject to a 30 m.p.h. speed limit.
