PRESENT,

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas by the Burial Act 1855 (1855 c. 128) it was, amongst other things, enacted that it should be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time

appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, should or should not have arrived), as to Her Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, might seem fit:

And whereas an Order in Council was made on the 9th day of September 1884, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") directing the discontinuance of burials in, amongst other places, Cowley Parish Churchyard, in the County of Oxford:

And whereas it seems fit to Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that the principal Order should be varied:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The principal Order shall have effect subject to the following exception or qualification, viz.:—

That notwithstanding anything in the said Order the burial may be allowed in existing family graves in the said Churchyard of the bodies of the following persons at their decease:—
