WAGES COUNCILS ACT 1959

Notice of Intention to make an Order abolishing The Paper Bag Wages Council (Great Britain)

The First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity (hereinafter referred to as "the Secretary of State") hereby gives notice that she intends, pursuant to her powers under section 4 of, and the First Schedule to, the Wages Councils Act 1959, to make an Order abolishing the Paper Bag Wages Council (Great Britain).

Objections to the draft Order must be sent to the Secretary of State at the above address to arrive not later than 17th September 1969. Every objection must be in writing and must state—

- (a) the specific grounds of objection, and
- (b) the omissions, additions or modifications asked for.

PRICES AND INCOMES ACTS 1966 and 1967

Reference to the National Board for Prices and Incomes of an agreement relating to the pay of certain workers employed by members of the Association of Film Laboratory Employers and notice of a direction in relation thereto under section 15 of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966 and section 2 of the Prices and Incomes Act 1967.

The First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity (hereinafter referred to as "the Secretary of State"), acting in pursuance of her powers under section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, hereby refers to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for their report the agreement made on or about 20th July 1969 between the Association of Film Laboratory Employers and the Association of Cinematograph, Television and Allied Technicians providing, with effect from 1st July 1969, for, amongst other things, increases in the minimum weekly rates of pay applicable to workers employed by members of the Association of Film Laboratory Employers in technical, clerical and general grades.

By virtue of the aforesaid reference the Secretary of State, acting in pursuance of her powers under section 15(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, as extended by section 2 of the Prices and Incomes Act 1967, hereby directs that the said section 15 shall apply to the agreement specified above by reference to 18th July 1969.

NOTE:—

This reference and direction take effect on the date of this issue of the Gazette. The direction that section 15 of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966 shall apply results in a standstill on the implementation of the agreement referred to in the direction until the publication (not later than 3 months from the said date) of the Board's report on the reference.

The standstill applies to the agreement by reference back to 18th July 1969 which date precedes the implementation of that agreement.

It should also be noted that, by virtue of section 1 of the Prices and Incomes Act 1967, as extended by section 3 of the Prices and Incomes Act 1968, the standstill may continue beyond publication of the Board's report if it should contain a recommendation adverse in any respect to the implementation of the said agreement.

HIGHWAYS ACT, 1959

The London—Fishguard Trunk Road (Llangyfelach to County Borough Boundary Detrunking) Order, 1969.

The Secretary of State hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 7 of the above Act providing that a length of the London—Fishguard Trunk Road at Llangyfelach, Glamorgan shall cease to be a trunk road as from the 1st April next after the date on which the Secretary of State notifies the Glamorgan County Council (who will become the highway authority responsible for that length) that the East of Llansamlet—Llangyfelach Special Road is open for through traffic.
