COVENTRY CITY COUNCIL CIVIC AMENITIES ACT, 1967

Designation of Conservation Areas

Notice is hereby given that the Coventry City Council as local planning authority under the provisions of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1962, has designated certain areas of the City as "Conservation Areas" under section 1 of the Civic Amenities Act 1967.

The object of such designation is to preserve the character or appearance of areas of special architectural or historic interest, as distinct from individual buildings, to control development in such areas and to stimulate and encourage measures to improve the environment.

The areas designated are described in the Schedule hereto.

Plans showing the areas are available for public inspection at the offices of the City Architect and Planning Officer, Earl Street, Coventry, during normal office hours.

SCHEDULE above referred to

- (i) *Greyfriars Green Conservation Area*
Greyfriars Green is situated in the southern sector of the central area of Coventry adjacent to the proposed Inner Ring Road, programmed for early construction. The southern boundary of the Conservation Area follows the line of Queens Road and will ultimately delineate the northern boundary of the proposed Inner Ring Road. To the west the boundary follows the rear of the properties fronting Warwick Row including Nos. 65 and 66 Queens Road at the southern end (grid ref. 330785) and No. 5 Warwick Row the Reform Club (at present) at the northern end (grid ref. 332786). The rear access road servicing The Quadrant forms the north-eastern and part of the eastern boundary, the remainder of

the eastern boundary being defined by the eastern extent of Greyfriars Green.

- (ii) *Priory Row/Hill Top Conservation Area*

Conservation Area number 5, the Hill Top and Cathedral area is situated between Broadgate and the recently constructed buildings of the Lanchester College of Technology on the east side of Priory Street. The northern boundary of the Conservation Area follows the line of New Buildings and includes the buildings on the east side of that road. It then follows a line between the Fairfax Street multi-storey car park and Kennedy House and continues in an easterly direction as far as Priory Street. To the east the boundary has been drawn to include the old burial ground which has been retained within the Lanchester College area (the landscaping and layout of which gained a Civic Trust Award in 1966). The remaining portion of the eastern boundary follows the building line of the Central Reference Library on the east side of Bayley Lane. Earl Street forms the southern boundary, as far as No. 1 Hay Lane, which then continues in a northerly direction to include the properties on the west side of Hay Lane, the County Hall and the site of the open air cafe. The final section of the boundary of this Conservation Area includes the Trinity Churchyard and the flower beds fronting onto Trinity Street and the properties 2-10 Trinity Street.

- (iii) *Lady Herbert's Garden Conservation Area*

Lady Herbert's Garden is located in the northern sector of the Central Area immediately to the south of the Inner Ring Road. The boundary of the Conservation Area follows the eastern side of the garden and includes the Cook Street Gate in the north (grid ref. 335795) and the Swanswell Gate in the south (grid ref. 335794). The western boundary lies to the west of the Coventry Theatre and continues in a northerly direction at the rear of the properties fronting Chantry Place.

- (iv) *Spon Street Conservation Area*

Spon Street is located on the western side of the central area, running in a westerly direction from its junction with Corporation Street. The extent of the Conservation Area includes the area covered by the Spon Street Townscape Scheme with additional areas on the south side of Spon Street and to the east of Hill Street. The northern boundary follows a building depth based on the ownership of properties on the north side of Spon Street from the line of the Inner Ring Road to the Holyhead Road. It then continues to include the garden area adjacent to the Coventry Garage, part of the Old City wall, Bonds Hospital and along the eastern side of Bond Street as far as and including Nos. 25 and 26 Bond Street (grid ref. 331792). The boundary then continues in a south-easterly direction to include land fronting onto the north-eastern side of Hill Street. To the east the boundary follows the line of Corporation Street to meet the southern boundary of the Conservation Area which runs parallel with and including a building depth along the south side of Spon Street from the Inner Ring Road.

CIVIC AMENITIES ACT 1967

Fareham, High Street—Designation of Conservation Area

Notice is hereby given that the Hampshire County Council, as local planning authority, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by section 1 of the Civic Amenities Act 1967, have designated the following area at High Street, Fareham, as a Conservation Area, being an area of special architectural or historic interest, the character of which it is desirable to preserve or enhance:

An area comprising the properties on both sides of the High Street and Union Street, and including properties in West Street (as far west as No. 5 (north side) and No. 8 (south side)) and in East Street (as far east as No. 13 (north side) and Bath Lane (south side)).

A copy of a plan showing the boundaries of the Conservation Area, together with a copy of a written statement setting out the local planning authority's policies relating to the Conservation Area, is available
