*The Cumberland County Council (Footpath Number 104026 Maryport) Public Path Stopping-up Order, 1969.*

Notice is hereby given that on the 30th July 1969, the Cumberland County Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to extinguish the public right of way running from the Levens Bridge—Carlisle Trunk Road A.596 at Risehow to Watergate Colliery in the Urban District of Maryport.

##### NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

##### TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1968, SECTION 94

*(LPU 59 Pucklechurch) Public Path Diversion Order, 1969*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 29th day of July 1969, is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Gloucestershire County Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert that length of the public footpath LPU 59 Pucklechurch starting at a

point 418 yards south of its junction with Abson Road (at the point marked "A" on the deposited plan) extending in a general westerly direction for a distance of about 112 yards (to the point marked "B" on the deposited plan) together with a length of the original footpath LPU 59 extending from the above-mentioned point "B" in a general southerly direction for a distance of about 213 yards (to the point marked "C" on the deposited plan). The new footpath commences at the point "A" referred to and extends in a south-easterly and thence in a south-westerly direction for a distance of about 280 yards (to the point "C" on the deposited plan).

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the offices of the Sodbury Rural District Council and may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, Chipping Sodbury, Bristol, between the hours of 9 a.m.—1 p.m. and 2 p.m.—5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the County Solicitor, Gloucestershire County Council, Shire Hall, Gloucester, not later than 11th September 1969, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Gloucestershire County Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Minister for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Minister with the Order.
