With regard to the prohibition of waiting on the roads specified in the Second Schedule to this notice exceptions are included in the Order to enable any vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from any vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from any vehicle or to enable a vehicle to be used in connection with any wedding funeral building operation or demolition the removal of any obstruction to traffic or the maintenance of the roads or the services

tion or demolition the removal of any obstruction to traffic or the maintenance of the roads or the services therein and to enable any vehicles to take in air water petrol or oil from any garage situate on or adjacent to the lengths of roads.

Any person who wishes to question the validity of this Order or of any provisions contained in it on the ground that it is not within the powers of the relevant section of the Act, or on the ground that any requirement of that section or of sections 84A, 84B and 84C of the Act or any regulations made under the said section 84C has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within six weeks of 13th August 1969 make application for the purpose to the High Court.

That section of road on the north-western side of Market Place which extends from a point approximately 22 yards north-east of its junction with Cornmarket, north-eastwards for a distance of approximately 58 yards.

SECOND SCHEDULE

(a) On both sides of Coxwell Street between its junction with Station Road and a point approximately 75 yards south-west of that junction.

(b) On both sides of London Street between its junction with Market Place and a point approximately 175 yards east of that junction.

(c) On both sides of Marlborough Street between its junction with Cornmarket and its junction with Bromsgrove Place.
