DUDLEY COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Dudley Corporation (Clarence Street and Dudley Road, Sedgley) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1969.

Notice is hereby given that the Dudley County Borough Council have made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968, the effect of which is to prohibit:

- (1) the waiting of vehicles between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays, inclusive, and
- (2) to prohibit the loading and unloading of goods from vehicles between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. and 6.30 p.m. inclusive, in the following lengths of road at Sedgley:

The usual exemptions are included in the Order, which will come into operation on Friday, 5th September 1969.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the ground that it is not within the powers of the relevant section of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act, or of any regulations made thereunder, have not been complied with in relation to

the Orders, may, within six weeks of the 12th August 1969, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

School Lane, Rassau (Prohibition of Through Traffic) Order, 1969

Notice is hereby given that the Ebbw Vale Urban District Council propose to make an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968, the effect of which will be:

- (a) to revoke the Ebbw Vale Urban (School Lane) (Prohibition of Through Traffic) Order, 1967; and
