

the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1968, or on the ground that any requirements of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may, under section 178 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1962, within 6 weeks from the 22nd August 1969, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

Nuneaton Town Map—First Quinquennial Review

Notice is hereby given, with reference to the earlier notice, dated the 20th day of December 1968, published on the 20th and 27th December 1968, that the Minister of Housing and Local Government proposes to withdraw his proposed Modification No. 14 to the Nuneaton Town Map Review, which allocated land near Bramdene Avenue, Weddington for a primary school and to allocate about 2.7 acres of the land on the east side of Oakdene Crescent, Weddington, GR.365934 as a primary school. The Minister's reason for this variation is that the Warwickshire County Council, as Local Planning Authority, do not now intend to use the land at Bramdene Avenue for educational purposes but intend instead to use the site at Oakdene Crescent, planning permission having been granted by the County Council on the 25th July, 1969, for this development.
