- Sides of the Lwerpool—Preston—Leeds Trunk Road (A.59), in the Borough of Clitheroe (hereinafter referred to as "the trunk road").
- 1. The eastern side of that length of the trunk road, known as Moor Lane and Castle Gate, which extends from a point 50 yards north of its junction with Woone Lane to a point 42 yards south-east of its junction with Parson Lane.

The Trunk Road (Princes Road, Dartford) (Restriction of Driving) Order, 1969

The Minister of Transport proposes to make an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which will be to prohibit:

- (a) the right-hand turn from Princes Road (A.2) at Dartford, Kent, into Gore Road; and
- (b) U turns in Princes Road (A.2) at Dartford, Kent, between its junction with the A.282 road and a point 100 yards east of its junction with Gore Road.

The Trunk Road (Bradford Road and Bingley Road, Shipley) (Restriction of Waiting) Order, 1969

The Minister of Transport has made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by the Transport Act, 1968, the effect of which is to prohibit the waiting of vehicles:—

- (a) between 8 a.m. and 9.30 a.m. or between 4.30 p.m. and 6 p.m. on any day other than a Saturday or Sunday in any of the lengths or on any of the sides of road specified in Schedule 1 to this notice; or
- (b) between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on any day other than a Sunday in either of the lengths or on any of the sides of road specified in Schedule 2 to this notice.

Exceptions are provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle, or to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein.

Any person who desires to question the validity of, or of any provision contained in, the Order, on the ground that it is not within the powers with respect to the Order conferred by the above Act, or on the ground that any requirement of, or of any instrument made under, any provision of that Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks of the 25th August 1969, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

- 2. The north-east side of that length of the trunk road, known as Bradford Road, which extends from a point 75 yards north-west of its junction with Otley Road to a point 10 yards east of the east side of its junction with Wensley Avenue.
- 3. The south-west side of that length of the trunk road, known as Bradford Road, which extends from a point 75 yards north-west of its junction with Otley Road to the east side of its junction with Wensley Avenue.

The Trunk Road (Various Roads, Long Eaton) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order, 1969.

The Minister of Transport proposes to make an Order under sections 1 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968, the effect of which will be to revoke the existing restrictions relating to the waiting of vehicles on parts of the North East of Birmingham-Nottingham Trunk Road (A.453) in the Urban District of Long Eaton, Derbyshire, and impose new restrictions on the entire length of the said Trunk Road
