##### *Diversion of Footpath off Bridge Street, Oakworth*

##### ACQUISITION OF LAND (AUTHORISATION PROCEDURE) ACT 1946 HIGHWAYS ACT 1959 COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1968

*The Kent County Council (Footpath No. 65 (part), Cliffe) Extinguishment of Public Right of Way Order, 1969.*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on 6th August 1969, is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation, or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the Kent County Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to extinguish the public right of way over that length of the footpath No. 65, Cliffe, leading from Church Street to Turner Street, which lies between points 110 feet and 510 feet eastwards and south-eastwards of the commencement of the footpath at the southern boundary of the Police Office.
