#### DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL

*The County of Devon (Various Streets, Teignmouth) (Traffic Regulation) Order, 1969*

Notice is hereby given that on 24th September 1969, the Devon County Council made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which is to consolidate in one Order all existing "one-way" and "no right-hand turn" restrictions and restrictions on waiting by vehicles in the Teignmouth Urban District (excluding Shaldon), with the following variations or additions:

Prohibition of waiting by vehicles at any time in—

*Myrtle Hill*, from a point 83 yards north of its junction with Brook Street East northwards to its junction with Lower Brimley and Glendaragh Road.

*Bitton Park Road*, from its junction with Park Hill to its junction with Chelsea Place.

*First Avenue*, east side west side, from its junction with Bitton Park Road northwards for a distance of 15 yards.
