### ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967

#### Imposition of 40 m.p.h. Speed Limit

*The London—Fishguard Trunk Road (Rhyd-sarnau, Cross Roads, Near Cross Hands Side Roads), Order 1969.*
