The Hampshire (Basingstoke Northern By-Pass) (Borough of Basingstoke—Part of Footpath No. 7 and Parish of Basing—Part of Footpath No. 26) Public Path Diversion Order 1969

Notice is hereby given that on the 8th December 1969, the Hampshire County Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed, is to divert the public right of way described in the first column of the Schedule hereto to the route described in the second column thereof.

Copies of the Order and of the map contained in it have been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the office of the Town Clerk, Municipal Offices, London Road, Basingstoke, and at the office of the undersigned during normal office hours.

This Order becomes operative as from the 16th January 1970, but, if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the power of the Highways Act, 1959, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any Regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he may, under Paragraph 2 of Schedule II to the Act, as applied by Paragraph 5 of Schedule VII to the Act, within 6 weeks from the 16th January 1970, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

SCHEDULE

Existing route of Path

(1)

From the footbridge crossing of the Basingstoke Northern By-pass at Black Dam in a southerly direction on the eastern side of the said By-pass to the footpath running alongside the disused Basingstoke Canal and thence in an easterly direction along that footpath to its junction with Redbridge Lane.

New route of Path

(2)

From the footbridge crossing of the Basingstoke Northern By-pass at Black Dam in an east/north-easterly direction to its junction at the site of the disused Basingstoke Canal of another existing footpath leading south-eastwards to Redbridge Lane. (313)

HEMEL HEMPSTEAD RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

The Hemel Hempstead Rural District Council (Footpath No. 20, Chipperfield Road, Kings Langley) Public Path Diversion Order, 1969.

Notice is hereby given that on the 6th January 1970 the Hemel Hempstead Rural District Council confirmed the above Order. Its effect is to divert a public right-of-way over land situate at Langley Vale, 134 Chipperfield Road, Kings Langley with effect from the 5th February 1970.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at "The Bury", Hemel Hempstead between 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. and 2 p.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

Any person who wishes to claim compensation as a result of the coming into operation of this Order should apply in writing to the Hemel Hempstead Rural District Council, "The Bury", Hemel Hempstead before the 6th July 1970.

The Order becomes operative as from the 16th January 1970 but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959 or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.

The Herefordshire County Council (Mordiford) Public Path Diversion Order, 1969

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order made on the 5th January 1970 is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation, or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by the Herefordshire County Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert that length of the public right of way at the rear of Nos. 14-16 Pentalo Close, Mordiford in the Parish of Fownhope between the sewage treatment plant at the west of

Pentalo Close and a stile in the hedge forming the northern extremity of the eastern boundary of No. 16 Pentalo Close to a line running from the sewage treatment plant to Pentalo Close in an easterly direction and thence in a northerly direction along the eastern boundary of No. 16 Pentalo Close, to connect with the continuing length of the said public right of way.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the office of the undersigned during normal office hours.

Compensation for depreciation or damage in consequence of the coming into operation of the Order is payable in accordance with section 113(2) of the Highways Act 1959.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the undersigned before the 16th February 1970 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Herefordshire County Council may instead of submitting the Order to the Minister of Housing and Local Government themselves confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Minister any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.
