DORSET COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Dorset (Brittwell Drive and Lulworth Hotel Road, West Lulworth) (Restriction of Waiting) Order, 1970.

Notice is hereby given that the Dorset County Council propose to make an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968.
