

6. #### REPORT BY THE NATIONAL BOARD FOR PRICES AND INCOMES

##### *Pay of the Armed Forces*

On 2nd November 1967, in pursuance of their powers under section 3(2) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, the Secretary of State for Economic Affairs, the Chancellor of the Exchequer and the Secretary of State for Defence instructed the National Board for Prices and Incomes to keep under continuous review the pay and allowances of members of naval, military or air forces of the Crown and of any women's service administered by the Defence Council. The Board has now made its Third report, and in accordance with section 5(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity, the Minister for the Civil Service, the Chancellor of the Exchequer and the Secretary of State for Defence hereby given notice that this report was first published as Command Paper Number 4291 on 25th February 1970.
