Conservation Area No. 1

The City Centre

From St. Giles' Gates in the west to Riverside Road in the east and from Whitefriars' Bridge in the north to Chantry Road and Farmers Avenue in the south, including the Cathedral Close, the Castle, Market Place, Civic Centre, Tombland, Prince of Wales Road, Chapel Field Gardens, the commercial and business areas and the cultural centre.

Conservation Area No. 2

Magdalen Street/Colegate

Including part of Magdalen Street, the old medieval quarter of the City and the shopping centre north of the river Wensum.

Conservation Area No. 3

St. Augustine's

Including parts of Sussex Street and of St. Augustine's Street, St. Augustine's Church and Gildencroft Cottages.
