The Import Duties (Temporary Exemptions) (No. 3) Order, 1970.

This Order provides for the temporary exemption from import duty, until 7th May 1970, of certain cleft pales of sweet chestnut.

#### ABRASIVE WHEELS REGULATIONS S.I. 1970, No. 535

The First Secretary and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity hereby gives notice that on 1st April 1970 she made the Abrasive Wheels Regulations 1970 under powers contained in the Factories Act 1961. These Regulations impose requirements in relation to abrasive wheels used in factories and in other premises and places to which the Factories Act 1961 applies. As respects abrasive wheels, the Regulations are in substitution for section 14 (1) of the Factories Act 1961, for Regulation 67 (2) of the Shipbuilding and Ship-repairing Regulations 1960 and for Regulation 42 of the Construction (General Provisions) Regulations 1961 (all of which require that dangerous parts of machinery shall be securely fenced).

The Regulations provide for the maximum permissible speeds of abrasive wheels to be specified and for the control of such speeds; for the proper mounting of abrasive wheels; for the training and appointment of persons permitted to mount abrasive wheels; for the provision and maintenance of guards and protection flanges for abrasive wheels; for the controls to be provided for machines in which abrasive wheels are used; for the securing and adjustment of rests for workpieces at abrasive wheels; for the affixing of cautionary notices as to the dangers from the use of abrasive wheels and the precautions to be observed; and for the condition of floors where there are machines on which abrasive wheels are mounted.
