TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England on Friday, the 17th April 1970, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, and the National Loans Act, 1968, to the amount of £80,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000 or £250,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 20th April 1970, to Friday, the 24th April 1970, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.
- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England,
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being a multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. Notifications will be sent, on the same day as Tenders are received, to the person whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part, and payments in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
- 7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
- 8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
- 9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

REPORT BY THE NATIONAL BOARD FOR PRICES AND INCOMES

Bread Prices and Pay in the Baking Industry (First . Report)

- 1. On 6th January 1970, in pursuance of their powers under section 2 (1) of the Prices and Incomes Act, 1966, the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity and the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food referred to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for examination the question of bread prices, with special regard to the industry's return on capital in relation to its investment requirements; the proposed arrangements for reviewing bread prices in future; and pay and other terms and conditions of employment of workers employed in the baking industry.
- 2. The Board has now made its first report entitled "Bread Prices and Pay in the Baking Industry (First Report)". In accordance with section 5(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act, 1966, the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity and the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food hereby give notice that the report was first published as Command Paper Number 4329 on 7th April 1970.

PAY AND OTHER TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT IN THE POTTERY INDUSTRY

Direction under Section 5 (4) Further Extending the period within which the National Board for Prices and Incomes must publish their Report.

1. Whereas the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity, in pursuance of her powers under section 2 (1) of the Prices and Incomes Act, 1966, referred the abovementioned question to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for examination and has published the
