HIGHWAYS ACT 1959

The London-Penzance Trunk Road (Chudleigh By-Pass Side Roads) Order 1970

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that, in relation to the new trunk roads to be constructed by him as a by-pass to Chudleigh and Chudleigh Knighton in the County of Devon, he has made

under section 9 of the above Act an Order, the effect of which is:

(a) to authorise the Minister—

(i) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways,

(ii) to stop up highways, and

(iii) to construct new highways, all at Chudleigh aforesaid, and

(b) to provide for the transfer of each of the said new highways to the County Council of Devon as from the date on which the Minister notifies that authority that the new highway has been completed and is open for through traffic.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959 or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act, or of regulations made thereunder, has been complied with in relation to the Order, may within six weeks from 1st May 1970, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

*The M.3 Motorway (Hawley-Lightwater Section)
(Side Roads No. 2) Order 1970*

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that in relation to a part of the Hawley-Lightwater Section of the M.3 Motorway which will be situated at Camberley in the county of Surrey, he has made under sections 13 and 18 of the above Act, an Order which will authorise the Minister to construct a short length of new highway, to stop up a private means of access and provide for the transfer of the said new highway to the Frimley and Camberley U.D.C. as from the 1st April next after the date on which the Minister notifies that authority that the new highway has been completed and is open for through traffic.
