

Cardigan (Cardigan) (Traffic Regulation) (Amendment) Order 1954, and delete references to the Third Schedule in the County of Cardigan (Priory Street, A.484 Cardigan) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1962; and

2. To prohibit the waiting of vehicles between 9 a.m. and 6 p.m.:—

(i) in any of the lengths of road or on any of the sides of road specified in Schedule 1 to this notice; and

(ii) on either of the sides of road specified in Schedule 2 to this notice for a longer period than one hour in any two hours.

Exceptions have been provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle; to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle; to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein; or to enable the vehicle to be used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

The time limit in (2), (ii) above does not apply to an invalid carriage; a vehicle issued to a disabled person by the Government in lieu of an invalid carriage; a vehicle left by the driver, who because of severe physical disability has been issued with an exemption by Cardiganshire County Council and such exemption is displayed on the vehicle in a prominent position; or a vehicle left by a driver who has been issued with a yellow car badge by any local authority under the disabled drivers' scheme and the badge is placed in a conspicuous position on the vehicle.

SCHEDULE 1

Lengths and sides of the Fishguard—Aberystwyth—Dolgellau—Caernarvon—Bangor (Menai Suspension Bridge) Trunk Road (A.487) (hereinafter referred to as "the trunk road"), at Cardigan in the county of Cardigan.

1. That length of the trunk road, known as Bridge Street, which extends from the northern end of Cardigan Bridge to a point 10 yards north of the north side of its junction with Cambrian Quay, a distance of approximately 63 yards.

2. The east side of that length of the trunk road, known as Bridge Street, which extends from a point 10 yards north of the north side of its junction with Cambrian Quay to a point 26 yards south of the south side of its junction with Quay Street, a distance of approximately 33 yards.

3. That length of the trunk road, known as High Street and Bridge Street, which extends from a point 26 yards south of the south side of its junction with Quay Street to the north side of its junction with St. Mary's Street, a distance of approximately 86 yards.

4. The east side of that length of the trunk road, known as High Street, which extends from the north side of its junction with St. Mary's Street to a point 73 yards north of that junction.

5. That length of the trunk road, known as High Street, which extends from a point 73 yards north of its junction with St. Mary's Street to its junction with Priory Street, a distance of approximately 108 yards.

6. That length of the trunk road, known as Pendre, which extends from its junction with Priory Street to a point 10 yards south-west of its junction with William Street, a distance of approximately 58 yards.

7. The south-east side of that length of the trunk road, known as Pendre, which extends from a point 10 yards south-west of its junction with William Street to a point 87 yards north-east of that junction, a distance of 97 yards.

8. That length of the trunk road, known as Pendre, which extends from a point 87 yards north-east of its junction with William Street to its junction with Napier Street, a distance of approximately 150 yards.

9. That length of the trunk road, known as North Road, which extends from its junction with Napier Street to its junction with the Cardigan—Gwbert

Road (B.4548), at Victoria Gardens, a distance of approximately 183 yards.

10. The north-east side of that length of the trunk road, known as Priory Street, which extends from a point 69 yards south-east of its junction with High Street to a point 116 yards south-east of that junction, a distance of 47 yards.

11. The west side of that length of the trunk road, known as Morgan Street, which extends:

(a) from its junction with that length of the trunk road, known as Priory Street, to a point 22 yards south-west of that junction; and

(b) from a point 42 yards south-west of its junction with that length of the trunk road, known as Priory Street, to its junction with that length of the trunk road, known as St. Mary's Street.

12. The east side of that length of the trunk road, known as Morgan Street, which extends from its junction with that length of the trunk road, known as Priory Street to its junction with that length of the trunk road, known as St. Mary's Street.

13. That length of the trunk road, known as St. Mary's Street, which extends from its junction with Morgan Street to its junction with Carrier's Lane, a distance of approximately 40 yards.

14. The west side of that length of the trunk road, known as Carrier's Lane, which extends:

(a) from its junction with that length of the trunk road, known as St. Mary's Street, to a point 26 yards south of that junction;

(b) from a point 63 yards south of its junction with that length of the trunk road, known as St. Mary's Street, to its junction with that length of the trunk road, known as Strand.

15. The east side of that length of the trunk road, known as Carrier's Lane, which extends from its junction with that length of the trunk road, known as St. Mary's Street, to its junction with that length of the trunk road, known as Strand.

16. That length of the trunk road, known as Strand, which extends from its junction with that length of the trunk road, known as Carrier's Lane to its junction with that length of the trunk road, known as Cardigan Bridge.

SCHEDULE 2

Sides of the Fishguard—Aberystwyth—Dolgellau—Caernarvon—Bangor (Menai Suspension Bridge) Trunk Road (A.487) (hereinafter referred to as "the trunk road"), at Cardigan in the county of Cardigan.

1. The west side of that length of the trunk road, known as High Street, which extends from the north side of its junction with St. Mary's Street to a point 73 yards north of that junction.

2. The north-west side of that length of the trunk road, known as Pendre which extends from a point 10 yards south-west of its junction with William Street to a point 87 yards north-east of that junction, a distance of 97 yards.

3. The west side of that length of the trunk road, known as Morgan Street, which extends from a point 22 yards south-west of its junction with that length of the trunk road, known as Priory Street, to a point 42 yards south-west of that junction.

4. The west side of that length of trunk road, known as Carrier's Lane, which extends from a point 26 yards south of its junction with that length of the trunk road, known as St. Mary's Street, to a point 63 yards south of that junction.

HIGHWAYS ACT, 1959

The London—Holyhead Trunk Road (Llanfairpwllgwyngyll, Anglesey Side Roads) Order 197

The Secretary of State hereby gives notice that he proposes, in relation to the above mentioned Trunk Road at Llanfairpwllgwyngyll in the County of Anglesey to make under section 9 of the above Act an Order which will:

(a) authorise the Secretary of State:

(i) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways,

(ii) to stop up highways, and

(iii) to construct new highways
