AMERSHAM RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1968— SECTION 94

The Amersham Rural District Council (Pt. Footpath No. 40—Parish of Penn) Stopping-up Order, 1970

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 20th day of July 1970, is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation, or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the Amersham Rural District Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert the public right of way running from Penn Road, Penn, for a distance of approximately 60 yards, at "Witheridge", Penn Road, Penn, in a westerly direction, to a line running parallel for approximately the same distance over the new estate road.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at Elmodesham House, 42 High Street, Amersham, between 9 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. on Monday to Friday.

If you wish to have sent to you in due course a notice to the effect that this Order has been confirmed, and a copy of the Order as confirmed, you should write to The Clerk to Amersham Rural District Council, 42 High Street, Amersham, giving your name, and address to which these documents may be sent.

Any objection or representation concerning the Order may be sent in writing to the Clerk, Amersham Rural District Council, 42 High Street, Amersham, not later than 1st day of September 1970, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Amersham Rural District Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Minister for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.

DRONFIELD URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1968— SECTION 94

The Dronfield Urban District Public Path No. 13 (Stopping-Up) Order, 1970

Notice is hereby given that on the 20th day of July 1970, the Dronfield Urban District Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to extinguish approximately 300 yards of the public right of way running from Oxclose Lane, Dronfield Woodhouse, to Gosforth Lane, Dronfield Woodhouse, and to create an alternative highway in lieu.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, Dronfield, Sheffield, S18 6PZ, between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on any day Monday to Friday.

This Order becomes operative as from the date on which the alternative highway has been provided but if any person aggrieved by the Order wishes to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1968, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may under section 178 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1962, within 6 weeks from 24th July 1970, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

DRONFIELD URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1968— SECTION 94

The Dronfield Urban District Public Path No. 13/15 (Stopping-Up) Order, 1970

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 20th day of July 1970, is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Dronfield Urban District Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to extinguish approximately 168 yards of public footpath No. 15 and approximately 103 yards of public footpath No. 13 at the point off Carr Lane, Dronfield Woodhouse, at which these paths cross and to create alternative highways in lieu.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it have been deposited at the Council Offices, Dronfield, Sheffield, S18 6PZ, and may be inspected there free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on any day Monday to Friday.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Dronfield Urban District Council not later than 28th August 1970, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Dronfield Urban District Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Minister for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Minister with the Order.

NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1968, SECTION 94

The "County of Glamorgan (Parish of Coychurch Lower—Footpath No. 7) Public Path Diversion Order 1970"

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 17th day of April 1970, was confirmed by the Glamorgan County Council as an unopposed Order, on the 9th July 1970.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed, is to divert the public rights of way running across land situate in the Parish of Coychurch Lower and more particularly described in the Schedule annexed hereto.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the offices of the undersigned and may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours.

This Order as confirmed becomes operative on the date on which it is certified to the developer by the County Council that the alternative highways described in Part II of the Schedule hereto have been provided to their reasonable satisfaction, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1968, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may under section 178 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1962, within 6 weeks of the date on which this notice is first published, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

SCHEDULE

PART I

Description of site of existing paths or ways

The highway to be diverted is in the Parish of Coychurch Lower in the Rural District of Penybont in the County of Glamorgan, namely:

A length of footpath 7 from a point approximately 30 yards north-westwards of its termination
