Gipping Rural District Council (Footpath Number 26 Baylham)

Public Path Diversion Order 1970

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order made on the 31st July 1970, is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the Gipping Rural District Council.

The effect of the Order if confirmed without modification will be to divert that part of Footpath No. 26 from a point in the south-western corner of Ordnance Survey Field Number 118 for a total distance of approximately 170 yards terminating at the north-eastern corner of Ordnance Survey Field Number 118 to a position on the northern boundary of Ordnance Survey Field Number 118 and running in a generally easterly direction along the northern boundary of Ordnance Survey Field Number 118 for a total distance of approximately 160 yards to join that remaining part of Footpath Number 26 which crosses the railway bridge. To divert that part of Footpath Number 26 which crosses Ordnance Survey Field Numbers 86A and 86 from the south-western corner of Ordnance Survey Field Number 86A to the northern boundary of Ordnance Survey Field Number 86 running for a total distance of 520 yards approximately to a position on the southern boundary of Ordnance Survey Field Number 86A running in a generally easterly direction for a distance of approximately 347 yards to the south-eastern corner of lock covert adjacent to the River Gipping.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order made on the 31st July 1970, is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the Gipping Rural District Council.

The effect of the Order if confirmed without modification will be to divert that part of Footpath No. 40 which commences at the eastern end of the lane adjacent to the School at Forward Green being an entrance to Ordnance Survey Field No. 308 and then runs in a generally easterly direction along the southern boundary of Ordnance Survey Field Number 308 for a distance of approximately 460 yards terminating at the south-eastern corner of Ordnance Survey Field Number 308 to a point commencing as previously described but running along the northern, eastern and part of the southern boundary of Ordnance Survey Field Number 308 to the south-eastern corner of Ordnance Survey Field Number 308 for a total distance of approximately 603 yards.
