#### A PROCLAMATION

REVOKING A PROCLAMATION, DATED THE 16TH DAY OF JULY 1970, DECLARING THE EXISTENCE OF A STATE OF EMERGENCY

#### ELIZABETH R.

Whereas by Our Proclamation, dated the sixteenth day of July, nineteen hundred and seventy, We declared that a state of emergency existed within the meaning of the Emergency Powers Act 1920, as amended by the Emergency Powers Act 1964:

And whereas it appears to Us that the state of emergency has now ceased to exist and that it is expedient that the said Proclamation should be revoked accordingly:

Now, therefore, We do, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby proclaim that the said Proclamation is revoked.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace this fourth day of August, in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and seventy, and in the mineteenth year of Our Reign.

#### Whereas:

- 1. Pursuant to section 353 of the Companies Act, 1948, Frazer & Sons (Surrey) Limited (hereinafter called "the Company") became dissolved on 20th August 1968
