*The Spilsby Rural District (Footpath No. 138
Hundleby) Public Path Diversion Order 1970*

Notice is hereby given that the above Order made on the 27th July 1970, is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation, or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert the part of the public footpath No. 138 at Hundleby running from the footbridge crossing the stream in the south-eastern corner of Enclosure No. 113, on O.S. Lincolnshire (Parts of Lindsey) Sheet LXXXII.4, Second Edition 1906, in a west-south-westerly direction for a distance of 50 yards to the gateway at the entrance to this field from the Horncastle/Spilsby Road, A.1115, to a line which commences at the same point and continues in a west-north-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 24 yards adjacent to and parallel with the existing chain link fencing surrounding the sewage pumping station and thence in a south-south-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 24 yards until it meets the Horncastle/Spilsby Road, A.1115.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at the Spilsby Rural District Council's Offices, Toynton Hall, Spilsby, between 9 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

Any objection or representation concerning the Order may be sent in writing to the Clerk of the Spilsby Rural District Council not later than the 14th September 1970, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Minister for con-
