The Borough of Scunthorpe (Prohibition of Driving Order, 1970

Notice is hereby given that on the 5th August 1970, the Scunthorpe Borough Council made the above-named Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968.

The effect of the Order is to prohibit any vehicle from entering or leaving:

- (a) Hallgarth Avenue at its junction with Trent Street; and
 - (b) The tenfoot road situate on the north side of the Post Office, Cole Street, at its junction with Cole Street,
- and the Order will come into operation on the 10th August 1970.

A copy of the Order and a map showing the roads affected may be examined at the office of the Borough Surveyor, Civic Centre, Scunthorpe, between the hours 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order you may within 6 weeks from the 5th August 1970, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

SOMERSET COUNTY COUNCIL

Somerset (Restricted Roads) (No.) Order, 197 Extension of 30 m.p.h. Speed Limit at East Huntspill

Notice is hereby given that the Somerset County Council propose to make an Order under sections 72(3) and 73(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968.

The County Borough of Walsall (Tilley Street, Darlaston) (Prohibition of Driving Order, 1970

WALSALL COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCIL

The County Borough of Walsall (Cemetery Road, Darlaston) (Revocation, Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order, 1970.
