- (2) to fix the maximum number of parking bays (i.e., spaces on the carriageway where vehicles may be left) in each parking place, to provide that the number and situation of such parking bays in each parking place may be determined by the Council and to provide that parts of certain parking places shall not be occupied by parking bays;
- (3) to provide that the parking bays may be used for the leaving of vehicles of any class or description specified in Schedule 2 hereunder, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive.
- (4) to provide that the initial charge for leaving a vehicle in a parking place shall be as indicated in Schedule 1;
- (5) to provide that an excess charge of ten shillings shall be incurred in respect of any vehicle left in a parking place for longer than the period for which payment was made by the initial charge;
- (6) to provide for the removal of a vehicle from a parking place if it has been left in the parking place for more than 2 hours after the excess charge was incurred or if the initial charge for leaving the vehicle has not been paid;
- (7) to prescribe the manner in which vehicles shall stand in parking places, to provide for the suspension of such parking places and to provide for the removal of any vehicle from such parking places in certain circumstances.

- (5) to provide that an excess charge of ten shillings shall be incurred in respect of any vehicle left in a parking place for longer than the period for which payment was made by the initial charge;
