The Chepstow Rural District Council (Footpath 73), Mathern Public Path Diversion Order, 1970

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on 3rd August 1970, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for Wales for confirmation, or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the Chepstow Rural District Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert the public right of way running from approach to Palace Farm, Mathern at boundary of Mathern Palace grounds via Palace Farm to bridge crossing railway line to a line running from approach to Palace Farm, Mathern, at boundary of Mathern Palace grounds via the eastern boundary of field O.S. 1647 Western boundaries of fields 3142, 2925, 2500 to bridge crossing railway line.
