Pedestrian Crossings

Notice is hereby given that the Greater London Council propose to submit for the approval of the Minister of Transport a Scheme whereby the Pedestrian Crossing Scheme for the London Borough of Harrow approved by the Minister of Transport on 12th May 1952 will be varied by:

- (i) the omission of the uncontrolled crossing over Uxbridge Road (A.410) 110 feet west of the junction with Grimsdyke Road;
- (ii) the addition of a push-button controlled (Pelican) crossing over Uxbridge Road (A.410) west of its junction with Grimsdyke Road.
