2. The monument (in respect of which an Interim Preservation Notice under section 10 of the Act is in force) is hereby placed under the more lasting protection of the Minister.

3. (1) (a) Any person having an interest in the whole or any part of the monument shall be entitled to receive compensation equal to the amount by which the value of that interest is diminished by the service of the Interim Preservation Notice and by the coming into operation of this Order.

(b) Such a person shall also be entitled to receive

compensation equal to

(i) the amount of any damage which he suffers in respect of his said interest in consequence of the refusal or the granting, subject to conditions, of consent to the demolition or removal of the monument or to the making of additions or alterations thereto or to the carrying out of work in connection therewith, and

(ii) the amount of any expenditure incurred by

(ii) the amount of any expenditure incurred by him in respect of his said interest in consequence of such refusal or such granting of consent subject to conditions.

(2) Any question as to whether a person has such interest as aforesaid or as to the nature or extent of that interest or as to the right of any such person to compensation or the amount of any such compen-sation shall be determined by the Lands Tribunal on the application either of the Minister or the person claiming such compensation.

(3) In the determination of any question as compensation payable pursuant to this Order it shall be assumed that this Order will not at any time be

revoked.

(4) Compensation payable in accordance with paragraph (a) of sub-clause (1) of this clause shall consist of a single payment to be finally assessed on the coming into operation of this Order.

(5) Compensation shall not be payable under sub-clause (1) of this clause for which a claim in writing

clause (1) of this clause for which a claim in writing

has not been made to the Minister before the expiry of three months after the coming into operation of this Order in the case of claims under paragraph (a) of sub-clause (1) or three months after the damage or expenditure has been suffered or incurred in the case of claims under paragraph (b) of sub-clause (1) or in either case such longer period as the Minister may allow showing the amounts claimed under the said paragraphs (a) and (b) respectively with such particulars as are necessary to explain how the several amounts are made up. has not been made to the Minister before the expiry

amounts are made up.
4. This Order may be cited as the Huggate Dykes (Middleham Plantation) Preservation Order 1970.
