DARLINGTON COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCIL

The County Borough of Darlington (Various Roads—Town Centre) (Limitation of Waiting) Order, 1970.

Notice is hereby given that on the 13th August 1970, the Darlington County Borough Council made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968, the effect of which is to limit (with certain exceptions) waiting by all types of vehicles

- (i) to a period of 30 minutes on all or part of the following roads:
 1. Horsemarket (except Mondays and Saturdays).
 2. Houndgate (south side).
 3. Quebec Street (west side).
- (ii) to a period of one hour on part of the south side of Beaumont Street and the north side of Tubwell Row, and
- (iii) to a period of two hours on all or part of the following roads:
 1. Barnard Street (west side).
 2. East Raby Street.
 3. Northumberland Street.
 4. Powlett Street.
 5. Primrose Street.
 6. South Arden Street (west side).
 7. Winston Street.

A copy of the Order, which comes into force on Monday 5th October 1970, and a map showing the lengths of road to which it relates may be inspected at the Town Hall, Darlington, between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

Exceptions are included in the Order for residents' and disabled drivers' vehicles.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or of any provisions contained in the Order on the ground that it is not within the powers of the relevant sections of the Act or on the ground that any requirement of those sections or of sections 84A, 84B or 84C of the Act or any regulations made under the said section 84C has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within six weeks of the date on which the Order was made make application for the purpose to the High Court.

DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Devon (Road at Meavy) (Weight Restriction) Order, 1970

Notice is hereby given that on 19th August 1970, the Devon County Council made an Order under sections 1 (1), (2) and (3) and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968.

When this Order comes into force on 24th August 1970, you will not be allowed to drive any motor vehicle, the unladen weight of which is over two tons, in that length of unclassified road No. 219 in the Parish of Meavy in the Rural District of Tavistock which extends from its junction with the Meavy-Dousland road (Class 3 road No. 578) at Meavy Cross, via Higher Meavy Bridge and Marchant's Cross to its junction with the Lovaton Cross-Lovaton road (Unclassified road No. 217) at Lovaton Cross.

Exceptions will permit the driving of vehicles, the unladen weight of which is over two tons, in the affected length of road for the purpose of:

- (1) conveying persons or goods to or from premises adjacent to the length of road;
- (2) agriculture in connection with adjacent land; or
- (3) building operations, road repairs or other similar works.

The existing Order restricting the use of this length of road by various types of heavy vehicles will be revoked.

Full details of the Order and a map showing the restricted length of road may be examined between 9 a.m. to 12.30 p.m. and 2.15 p.m. to 5 p.m., Mondays to Fridays, either at Room G.33, County Hall, Exeter, or at the Rural District Council Offices, Kilworthy Hill, Tavistock.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, or on the grounds that any requirements of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks from the 19th August 1970, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Devon (Road at Croyde Bay) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1970

Notice is hereby given that on 14th August 1970, the Devon County Council made an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968.

When this Order comes into operation on 24th August 1970, you will not be allowed to leave your vehicle between 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. daily from 1st June to 30th September each year in the unclassified road No. 74 at Croyde Bay (leading from Moor Lane to Croyde Bay Hotel and the beach), and its junction with Moor Lane southwards and south-westwards for a distance of 92 yards.

Exceptions will permit waiting for the purpose of:

- (a) picking up and setting down passengers;
 - (b) loading or unloading goods;
 - (c) collecting or delivering postal packets for the Post Office;
- and, where necessary, in connection with:
- (d) the maintenance of the road; and
 - (e) the supply of gas, electricity and water.

A copy of the Order and a map showing the restricted area may be examined during normal office hours at the Rural District Council Offices, Civic Centre, Barnstaple, or at Room G.33, County Hall, Exeter.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks from the 14th August 1970 apply to the High Court for this purpose.
