SOUTHAMPTON CITY COUNCIL

The City of Southampton (Controlled Zone) (Prohibition of Waiting) (No. 1) (Amendment) (No. 7) Order 1970.

WEST SUSSEX ADMINISTRATIVE COUNTY COUNCIL

*(Lancing: Brighton Road (A.259))
(Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1970*

Notice is hereby given that on the 24th August 1970, the West Sussex County Council made an Order under the provisions of section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968, the effect of which is to prohibit waiting at all times on the following lengths of Brighton Road (A.259) in the Parish of Lancing:

North side:

(1) From a point 6 yards west of the west kerb line of The Broadway westwards for a distance of 7 yards

(2) From a point 35 yards west of the west kerb line of The Broadway westwards for a distance of 13 yards.

South side:

(1) From a point opposite the west kerb line of The Broadway westwards for a distance of 48 yards and eastwards for a distance of 22 yards.

(2) From a point 50 yards east of a point opposite the west kerb line of The Broadway eastwards for a distance of 41 yards.

The usual exceptions are provided in the Order, which will come into operation on the 1st September 1970.

A copy of the Order and a map showing the lengths of road to which the Order relates may be inspected at the County Hall, Chichester, during normal office hours.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in the Order on the ground that it is not within the powers of the relevant section of the Act or on the ground that any requirement of that section or of section 84A, 84B or 84C of the Act or any regulation made under the said section 84C has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made, viz., 24th

August 1970, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

WEST RIDING OF YORKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

The County Council of the West Riding of Yorkshire (Holes Lane, Knottingley) (One-Way Traffic) Order, 1970.
