PRICES AND INCOMES ACT 1966

PROPOSALS BY THE LONDON TRANSPORT EXECUTIVE FOR FARES INCREASES

Direction under section 5 (4) extending the period within which the National Board for Prices and Incomes must publish their Report.

Whereas the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity and the Minister of Transport in pursuance of their powers under section 2 (1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, referred the abovementioned question to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for examination and have published the text of the reference in the Gazette on 29th May 1970.

And whereas by section 5 (3) of the Act, but subject to section 5 (4), the Board are required to make their report so as to allow publication within 3 months of the said date.

Now, therefore, the Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity and the Minister of Transport, in pursuance of their powers under the said section 5 (4), hereby direct that the said period of three months be extended by three months.

The Trunk Road (Various Streets, Machynlleth) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1970 Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State has made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which is to prohibit waiting:

- (a) on any of the sides of road specified in Schedule 1 to this notice; and
- (b) between the hours of 8 a.m. and 7 p.m. on any day other than a Sunday on any of the sides of road specified in Schedule 2 to this notice for a longer period than 45 minutes in any 2 hours.

Exceptions have been provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle; to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle; to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein; or to enable the vehicle to be used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

The time limit in (b) above does not apply to an invalid carriage; a vehicle issued to a disabled person by the Government in lieu of an invalid carriage; a vehicle left by the driver, who because of severe physical disability has been issued with an exemption by Montgomeryshire County Council and such exemption is displayed on the vehicle in a prominent position; or a vehicle left by a driver who has been issued with a yellow car badge by any local authority under the disabled drivers' scheme and the badge is placed in a conspicuous position on the vehicle.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within 6 weeks from the 18th August 1970 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order.
