The Exeter-Leeds Trunk Road (Southern Connection from Gloucester to M5, Side Roads) Order 197

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make the following Orders:

1. An Order under sections 7 and 44 of the above Act providing-

(a) that a road which he proposes to construct at Quedgeley and Hardwick in the County of Gloucester and a length of existing highway at Quedgeley in the County of Gloucester and the City and County Borough of Gloucester shall become trunk road as from the date when the Order comes

into operation, and

- (b) that the length of the Exeter-Leeds Trunk
 Road to be superseded shall cease to be a
 trunk road as from the 1st April next after
 the date on which notice is given by the
 Minister to the County Council of
 Gloucester and the Council of the City and County Borough of Gloucester (who will become the highway authority responsible for the part of that length in their respective area) that the new road is open for through traffic; and
- 2. An Order under section 9 of the above Act authorising the Minister—
 - (a) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways,

(b) to stop up highways, and

(c) to construct new highways,

all at Quedgeley and Hardwick aforesaid, and providing for the transfer of each of the said new highways to the highway authority specified therefore in the Order as from the date on which the Minister notifies that authority that each new highway has been completed and is open for through traffic.

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes, in relation to the above-mentioned Trunk Road east of Doveridge in the County of Derby, to make under section 9 of the above Act an Order which will:

(a) authorise the Minister-

- (i) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways,
- (ii) to stop up highways, and (iii) to construct new highways,

all east of Doveridge aforesaid and

(b) provide for the transfer of each of the said new highways to the County Council of Derby as from the date on which the Minister notifies the Council that the new highways have been completed and are open for through traffic.

The Trunk Road (Prohibition of Waiting) (Clearways) The Minister of Transport proposes to make an Order under section 1(1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which will be:

- to prohibit waiting on any of those main carriageways forming part of the Birmingham-Great Yarmouth Trunk Road (A.47) which are specified in the Schedule hereto; and
- to prohibit waiting by any vehicle for the pur-pose of trading, unless the goods are immediately delivered at or taken into premises adjacent to the vehicle, on any verge or lay-by adjacent to the said main carriageway.

The Prohibition imposed by the Order will not

(a) to a vehicle waiting upon the direction or with

the permission of a police constable in uniform;

(b) so as to prevent a vehicle from being used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or of any of the services therein;

(c) to a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambu-

lance or police purposes;
(d) to a vehicle being used for the purpose of

delivery or collecting postal packets;
(e) to a vehicle being used by or on behalf of a local authority for the purpose of collecting household refuse or clearing cesspools;

(f) to a vehicle waiting while any gate or other barrier at the entrance to premises to which the vehicle requires access or from which it has emerged is being opened or closed, if it is not reasonably practicable for the vehicle to wait elsewhere; and

(g) to a vehicle waiting in any case where the person in control of it:

erson in control or it:

(i) is required by law to stop;

(ii) is obliged to stop to avoid an accident; or

(iii) is prevented from proceeding by circumstances outside his control and cannot remove the vehicle from the main carriageway.
